## DEAR COLLECTOR...

Hello and welcome to the fourth and final edition of The Collector for 2018. Inside, we are very pleased to bring you four new releases to add to your collection.

In October, our stamp issue (see Page 4) calls to mind the catastrophic sinking of the RMS Leinster mailboat in the Irish Sea in the final year of World War I. This was the worst-ever incident involving an Irish-owned ship.

Women aged 30 or older who were university graduates or owned a certain amount of property were granted the right to vote for the first time in the General Election in Britain and Ireland in 1918. This followed lengthy campaigning by suffragettes, including Hanna Sheehy Skeffington, who is featured in one of our 'Popular Democracy' stamp issue – see Page 6 for more information.

This year's Christmas stamps have two very attractive offerings which are featured on Pages 8 and 9. A set of seven stamps will depict special Christmas moments emphasising long-standing seasonal traditions. In addition, a new product is being introduced, which will complement the Elf on the Shelf range that is rapidly

gaining popularity in Ireland. This pack will feature a specially designed, limited edition Elf on the Shelf stamp – not to be missed!

Armistice Day – November 11, 1918 – marked the end of the war, in which it is estimated that up to 49,000 Irishmen died. In honouring the memory of all those who perished, one of our two stamp designs commemorating this day (see Page 10) features the well-known Irish war-time poet, Thomas Kettle.

Finally, a reminder: if you haven't obtained stamps issued this time last year, be sure to check out our Last Chance Saloon section on Page 14 where you can claim stamps featuring Postcrossing, Apparitions of Fatima and Christmas 2017.

So, until the New Year and the next edition of The Collector, everyone here at Irish Stamps would like to wish you and yours a very Happy Christmas and a peaceful New Year.

## STAMPA 2018

## SOAR COMMEMORATIVE STAMPS

From August 2018, An Post Stamp Design introduced eight new stamp images to the SOAR roll. These images were selected from An Post's annual programme of commemorative stamps, 2016 – 2018 and represent different aspect of Irish life and culture.

The SOAR Definitive stamps – Ninth Definitive Series, Phase Two of 'A History of Ireland in 100 Objects, a selection' will also continue to appear on SOAR rolls. The order that the stamps will appear on SOAR rolls is as follows: Definitive Series, stamps 1-8 and commemorative, stamps 9-16. This rotation will alternate after each run of 16 stamps.

The commemorative stamps featured are:

- Bicentenary of the opening of the General Post Office
- Europa Bridges, Boyne Viaduct
- 50th Anniversary of the founding of Na Píobairí Uilleann
- Urban Street Art, Irish Deer by James Earley
- Royal Sites of Ireland, Rock of Cashel
- Irish Shop Fronts, Clerkes Shop, Skibereen
- Wild Atlantic Way, Horse riding in Sligo
- Wild Atlantic Way, Surfing in Kerry





# RMS LEINSTER 1918

## “Centenary of the sinking of the RMS Leinster”

The sinking of the mailboat, RMS Leinster, in the Irish Sea by a German submarine in 1918 had a particularly devastating impact on the Irish postal service. The estimated death toll of 567 included 21 of the 22 postal workers who were working in the mailroom on board, as the boat made its way from Kingstown (now Dún Laoghaire) to Holyhead in Wales.

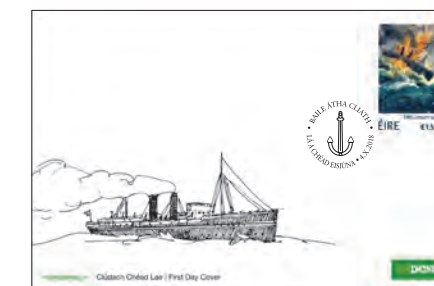
Other passengers included Irish members of the British forces and other military personnel returning to fight in World War I, medical staff and civilian passengers.

The RMS Leinster torpedo sinking is the worst single disaster in that stretch of water and the greatest ever tragedy to involve an Irish-owned ship. Despite the likelihood (definite statistics are unavailable) that more Irish people perished than were lost on the Titanic in 1912 or on the Lusitania in 1915, the sinking has been overshadowed by these two incidents. However, books on the subject by authors such as Philip Lecane and Roy Stokes have highlighted its devastating consequences.

An official commemoration will take place in Dún Laoghaire on October 10 to mark the centenary of the actual date of the sinking and to remember those who perished. This will entail a significant cultural element, as well as a formal commemoration and wreath-laying ceremony, with participation by the Irish Naval Service. On that date, the vessel will also come under the protection of the National Monuments Act, which covers all shipwrecks over 100 years old.

# POPULAR DEMOCRACY

“Popular Democracy”

The role of women in politics and other aspects of civic society is a much-discussed topic in Ireland at present. The introduction of gender quotas for election candidate selection by political parties was one of the factors that led to the highest-ever number of female TDs (35) being elected to Dáil Éireann in 2016.

This increase in representation is timely, given the fact that this year marks the centenary of when women were first granted the right to vote in the 1918 British General Election, held on December 14.

The special stamp we will issue to mark the centenary, which is designed by Ger Garland, features one of the prominent Irish suffragette campaigners, Hanna Sheehy-Skeffington, who co-founded the Irish Women's Franchise League (IWFL) in 1908.

Incidentally, Hanna's role and an original embroidered banner used by the IWFL are featured in a special exhibition organised by the Houses of the Oireachtas, in collaboration with the National Museum and the Sheehy-Skeffington family, which runs until October 19 at Leinster House.

An innovative 'pop-up' exhibition, highlighting both the familiar and not-so-familiar women who have contributed to Irish public life over the past 100 years, will be staged from November until January 2019. Curated by historian Sinéad McCool, it will be held in the Coach House at Dublin Castle.

The second stamp to be issued on the theme of Popular Democracy commemorates another highly significant aspect of the 1918 election, when the nationalist Sinn Féin party secured a landslide victory over the Irish Parliamentary Party. This ultimately led to the establishment of the Irish Free State in 1922.

# ARMISTICE DAY

## “Centenary of Armistice Day”

November 11, 1918 is known as Armistice Day – the day when an agreement was signed between the Allied forces and Germany in a train carriage at Compiègne in northern France, which marked the end of World War I. The date has huge significance for many Irish people and we are issuing two stamps to mark this historic event.

At least 200,000 Irishmen served with British forces during the four-year war, and some estimates put the number who died at over 49,000.

While their role may have been largely overlooked in the years that followed, due to complex factors affecting Irish-British relations such as the 1916 Easter Rising and the subsequent War of Independence, their service and sacrifice have now been rightly acknowledged and commemorated.

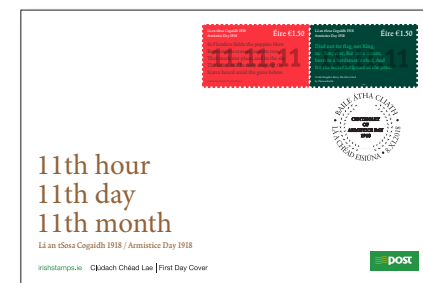
Each year, they are honoured at the National Day of Commemoration ceremony held in Collins Barracks, Dublin in July. In addition, special State ceremonies are planned to mark the centenary of Armistice Day on November 11 this year.

One of our stamps feature an extract from a poem, To My Daughter Betty, the Gift of God, by Irish poet, parliamentarian, intellectual and journalist, Thomas Kettle. Artane, Dublin-born Kettle was a Member of Parliament for the Irish Parliamentary Party and an Irish Volunteer who later joined the National Volunteers and served in the British Army during World War I. He died during the Somme Offensive in 1916.

The second stamp features an extract from In Flanders Fields by the Canadian poet,

## Centenary of the apparitions of Fatima:

Issue Date: 12 October, 2017

Withdrawal Date: 12 October, 2018

On 13 May, 1917, near the village of Fatima, the Virgin Mary appeared before the three young children. She asked for prayer, especially that of the Holy Rosary, reparation and consecration. The apparitions of Our Lady of Fatima are famous for the three-part "secrets" they conveyed. Of these, the "third secret" is the most famous, because it was kept confidential at the Vatican for many years. The Anniversary of Our Lady of Fatima is celebrated each year on 13 October.

The stamp was designed by Martin Barlow and features a statue from Fatima of the Virgin Mary.



## Christmas 2017:

Issue Date: 02 November, 2017

Withdrawal Date: 02 November, 2018

An Post issued three stamps in 2017 to once again celebrate Christmas. The stamps were designed by Red&Grey Design, using original artwork by Liz Rackard. The SOAR stamps depict traditional Christmas scenes. These are represented by a group of carol singers on the National stamp and a reindeer with Christmas lights on his antlers on the International stamp. The booklet stamp portrays the three wise men bearing gifts and following the Star of Bethlehem.

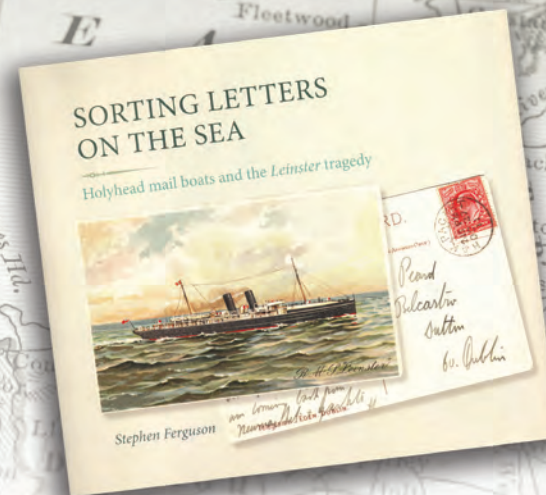
# Sorting letters on the Sea

## Holyhead mail boats and the Leinster tragedy

Shortly before 9 a.m. on the morning of 10 October 1918, the Royal Mail Steamer Leinster left Dún Laoghaire on its usual run over to Holyhead in Wales. Passengers, including many soldiers who had been enjoying a few days holiday in Ireland, chatted in the ship's lounges whilst below decks, Post Office staff began their work in the ship's sorting office, situated two levels below the passenger deck.

Unknown to them all, Robert Ramm, commander of the German submarine UB-123, was patrolling close to the Kish lightship. When he saw the Leinster come into sight, he fired three torpedoes at the ship. The first missed, the second struck the Post Office and the third, a little later, hit the ship amidships. Well over 500 people died that morning and within a few days the submarine crew would also be dead, lost when their submarine struck a mine on its way home.

Stephen Ferguson's new book, written to mark the anniversary of the Leinster's



sinking, tells the story of the tragedy that befell one of the fastest, most elegant and most efficient ships to sail the Irish Sea. Remarkably, the tale of Ireland's worst maritime disaster has been largely forgotten over the years and in this handsomely produced and illustrated book the author reveals the close connections that united the Post Office with the Holyhead mail boats.

Drawing on unpublished material in Post Office and other archives, he sets the disaster in context, explores the importance of the postal connection between Ireland and Britain and recalls, in particular, the 21 Post Office men who lost their lives that day, sorting letters on the sea.
